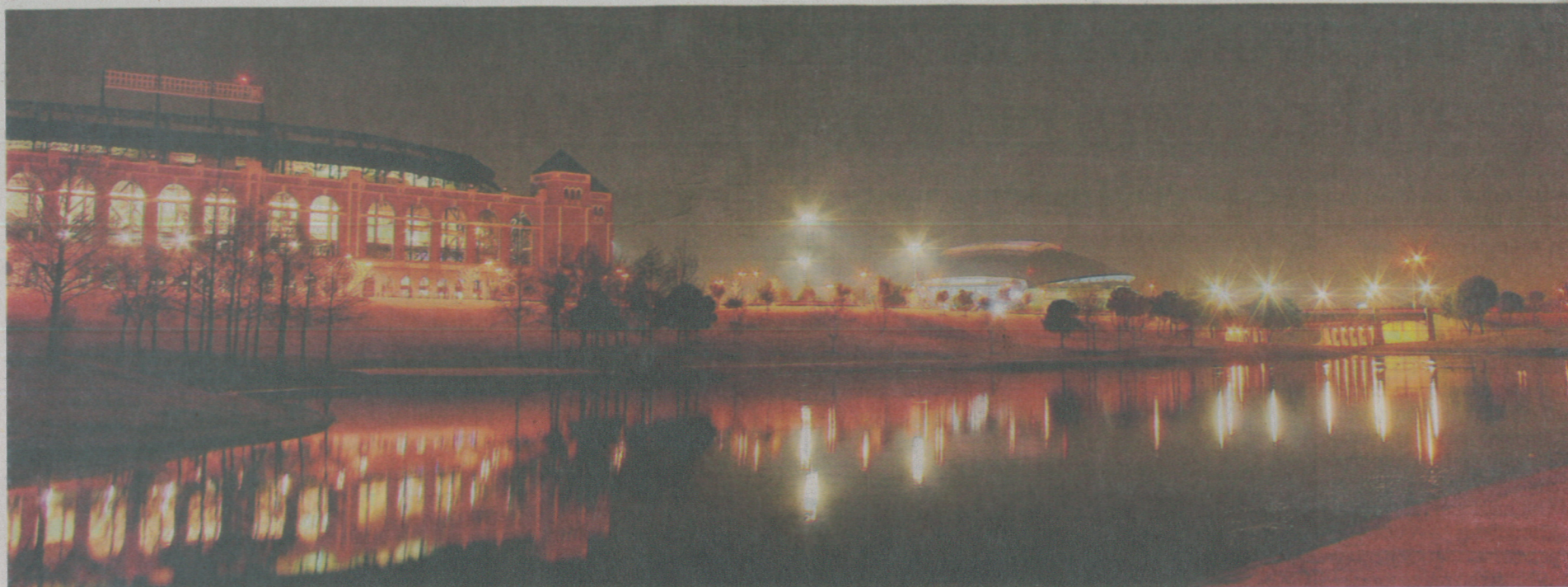




Arlington's pro sports venues are lit up at night in this entry in the *Citizen-Journal's* Facebook cover photo contest.
