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## Rick Reidy

DIRECTOR, TEXAS GOVERNOR'S SCHOOL

Richard F. Reidy is an associate professor of Materials Science and Engineering at the University of North Texas. He has a B.A. from Rice University (Chemistry and Biochemistry) and an M.S. and Ph.D. from Penn State (Metals Science and Engineering). He has published over 53 technical papers and received over \$1.4 million in external research grants. In 2005, he testified on nanotechnology before the Research Subcommittee of the **US** House of Representatives Committee on Science and Technology. His current research is on semiconductor materials, antibacterial wound care, and advanced body armor. Throughout his academic career, he has actively participated in K-12 science education: science fair judging, Science Day programs, and on site demonstrations. During summers, sixteen students from the Texas Academy of Mathematics and Science have conducted research in his laboratory-most recently developing novel wound care products using silver nanoparticles.


Shawn Nikah Bose House Director
